


Blessing of the Animals Service

Spring Pilgrimage to Israel

Our Lenten Pilgrimage: Seeking Jesus with Heart, Soul, and Mind is scheduled for March 4 -15, 2007. The cost of the pilgrimage is \$2,699 per person double occupancy. This cost DOES NOT include airline taxes and fuel surcharges that due to the volatility of the airline business and fuel costs cannot be determined until the time of final ticketing approximately 30 days before departure. This cost includes all of your air and ground transportation, hotels and all your breakfasts and dinners and some lunches. We have some very nice accommodations booked for the trip and you will eat well.

Israel is a beautiful country that blends the ancient with the modern in often indescribable ways. You cannot go to Israel without encountering the politics of the country in often surprising ways. This is one reason I have insisted on a guide with whom I have experience. He will not be a guide that forces his own political views on the pilgrim nor will he miss an opportunity for you to be aware of what is happening in his beloved country. A Palestinian Christian, I watched George one morning be the only person searched by the guards out of countless people entering our hotel in Jerusalem.

When asked about it later, he was both wise and fair in understanding the concerns that come with living together in this fascinating country. Given a perfect opportunity to sermonize, he didn't.

He both understood the many dimensions of a complex political situation and was eager for us to understand as well. He will be an excellent guide.

The events of the last few months remind us of the complexities of living together as Israeli and Palestinian. We appear to be moving into a season of peace — or at the least cessation of hostilities. I am told by our tour company that pilgrims have returned in record numbers to this holy land. As I said when I returned in December, 2005, I met many people who all seemed to have the same hopes and desires we have here in East Cobb. They, like us, have

It pleases me to announce that The Rev. Kathy Holman will be joining our staff as Deacon beginning Sunday, September 24. Kathy is a vocational deacon and was recently ordained in August.

I have known Kathy and worked with her for several years in a variety of capacities. I know her to be faithful, prayerful and insightful. She is a trained spiritual director having been trained at the Shalem Institute in Bethesda, Maryland. One form of ministry she will bring to St. Catherine's is her continuing spiritual direction work with individuals both in and outside of the church.

Kathy's most visible role will be in the liturgy. In Ormand Plater's words, "deacons are the principal helpers, the

most active of all who serve in the liturgy. They are heralds of the word, servants of the church, and agents of the bishop." She will proclaim the gospel, set the table, clear the table and dismiss us into the world. This is appropriate because her role as a deacon is to interpret the world to the church and the church to the world.

Kathy and her family will be at the newcomer's coffee on Sept. 24. I hope you can meet and greet her, her husband Bill and their two sons. Over the coming months I have asked Kathy to visit our Christian formation classes to develop her understanding of who we are and what priorities we have as the body of Christ here at St. Catherine's. She will also begin to do some teaching in a variety of venues so that all of us have a deeper appreciation of the ministry and role of a vocational deacon.

It contains marvelous stories and the best part is they are stories about us and about how we are created by God, loved by God, disappoint God, but are always redeemed by God.

Bill Moyers, in his ground-breaking TV show "Genesis" said this about Genesis:

I marvel at the power of these stories and have never tired of them – God walking in the Garden in the cool of the evening, the wily logic of the serpent, the violent jealousy of Cain, Jacob's bold lie to his father, the unbearable moment of Isaac under the upraised knife of Abraham. They have been familiar to me since childhood, although they were sanitized in Sunday school by elders who thought it best to protect the fragile sensibilities of the innocent (if only they had known what we were reading between the covers of those hymnals during sermons!). So it was not until much later that I noticed just how imperfect were the human instruments God had chosen – Abraham, who offers Sarah to the Pharaoh to save his own skin, the deceitful Jacob, the vain Joseph, the drunken Noah, who cruelly curses his grandson.


Vestry Notes



a desire to make a living, to educate their children, to leave the world a better place because they were here, and to live peaceable with one another. Like with most world events and through no fault of the press who has to report those events, we hear mostly of the radical no matter their position either left or right. When you go to Israel you leave the country with a completely different view of the complexities that are too often reduced to simple stereotypes.

Jesus, no doubt, lived with those same complexities. Just think of his story of the Good Samaritan. One might imagine that same story told today in the holy land and hear asked the ancient question: is there such a thing as a good Palestinian. Traveling in this land gives you new ears to hear and new eyes to see what Jesus proclaimed by saying that we are called to love God and love our neighbor. Such a learning has much to commend itself to us in this world in which we live today.

I invite you to set aside 11 days in March, 2007 to join your fellow pilgrims as we go in search not of the historical Jesus although we'll find much about him but the Jesus who lives among us today and calls us to seek peace and justice among all people and respect the dignity of every human being. I assure you, you will return from the Holy Land changed by the sights and sounds of a land bruised and scared by battles in the past and, no doubt as recent events prove, for years to come, but nonetheless the place where God chose to come in flesh to call us to live together as one people in his name. In what other place could the scandal of the incarnation be any more clear?
