A Trip to Macon

Someone asked me last week what I looked forward to when it came to Diocesan Council. It's certainly not the crowded conditions or the bad food or even the parliamentary procedures that wrestle any life out of the proceedings. What it is for me is seeing "the family." It's a delight to see people I haven't seen for a year, to see good friends I might have had lunch with last week, making new acquaintances, and see parishioners as they staff a table for their particular diocesan-wide ministry or work in a setting I'm not used to seeing them work in.

This the amazing thing about our church. We are a part of something so much bigger than ourselves. I am always amazed at the variety and the vibrancy of the ministries we share in common. This year we welcomed the new bishop of the diocese of Ecuador Central. We have had a long-standing Companion Diocese relationship with Ecuador Central but in recent years, because of church politics, the relationship has not been active. The Rt. Rev. Wilfrido Ramos-Orench was installed as bishop in June. He was previously the Bishop Suffragan of Connecticut. Born and raised in

Puerto Rico he accepted the call to Ecuador after the previous bishop was deposed for conduct that left the diocese in disarray. To hear his story was truly inspiring, and to know that at so many levels he is part of the family to which we are connected. He spoke of the fine work in Ambato of which we have been a critical participant. It was good to hear that the work goes on and there is now some hope that we can get re-involved in supporting the school and the St. Catherine's medical clinic.

This is just one example of the family at work throughout the world. Yes, like all families we have our disagreements and squabbles. But I'll live with them just to have this sense of something far bigger than me, St. Catherine's or even the many ministries we work hard at here in our home. The Anglican communion in general, and the Episcopal Church in particular, has much to offer the world. In a world where many people live in the extremes, we offer a middle way. It is good to feel a part of something bigger than ourselves and to know in our own unique way here at 571 Holt Road we are carrying out a ministry that has ties throughout the state, the nation and the world.

Israel Trip Planning

We invite you to consider traveling together with us to this holiest of lands. It is from there that we will set our sights on what will be a meaningful Holy Week journey together here at St. Catherine's.

Our deadline for registration is January 3 but we really are encouraging you to **register by December 3** so that we can have the best feel for what seats will be required for our air transportation.

To whet your appetite, a typical day on the trip will be like the following:

DAY 7, Monday, March 12, 2007 -

From Galilee "up to Jerusalem" through Samaria: This day will find us following the footsteps that Jesus and his family would have taken as they made their way from Galilee to Jerusalem. The road passes through a string of Arab villages, many of them with names recalling incidents in the Bible. Jenin, for example, is where tradition holds that Jesus cured the 10

lepers (Luke 17:11). We proceed to ancient Sebaste, a Hellenistic city where John the Baptist, according to tradition, was beheaded at the birthday party of Herod Antipas (Mark 6:17). We shall move on to Schechem (Nablus). Here we shall visit and drink from Jacob's well (Gen. 33:18), where Jesus asked the Samaritan woman for a drink promising her "living water" (John 4). In Schechem we find ourselves between Mt. Gerizim and Mt. Ebal, in the Valley of Blessings and Curses (Josh. 8:30). We recall that Mt. Gerizim was for the Samaritans the Holy Mountain. We now proceed to Jericho, the oldest human settlement in the world. From the vantage point of the site in Jericho we have a spectacular view of the "Mt. of Temptation." Driving up to Jerusalem, we view the setting for the parable of the Good Samaritan, and walk to St. George's Greek Orthodox Monastery, literally carved out of a cliff. Once in Jerusalem we find a site on Mt. Zion or the Mt. of Olives in order to view the city for ourselves. Then it's on to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Who is your new Deacon?

My last two articles have introduced you to what a deacon is and how one becomes a deacon. This time, I want to give you a bit more information about who I am and where I’ve come from and maybe even how I ended up here.

I was raised in the Presbyterian Church. My family moved from Chicago, Illinois to Atlanta when I was in 4th grade. Upon our move, my parents found the Southern Methodist Church to be more like the Northern Presbyterian Church, so we joined Sandy Springs Methodist Church and made it our church home. When I was 16, I found myself overwhelmed with a feeling of “coming home” when I entered the chapel at Sewanee. (I had gone to Monteagle, TN with a friend of mine and this is where we went for Sunday worship) Soon after this experience, I was confirmed in the Episcopal Church and have been an active member ever since.

I graduated from college with a Bachelor’s degree in Philosophy and Religion. The month after my graduation, I married Bill and we started our family. (Bill and I have been married for 31 years and we have two sons – Rob, 28 and Jeff, 26.) Years later, I completed EFM and two years of graduate level work at the Shalem Institute of Spiritual Formation where I received a certificate of completion in Spiritual Guidance. My continued spiritual education has included pilgrimage and study trips. I have traveled to Israel, Turkey, Spain, Ireland, Scotland, England, Germany, and New Mexico. I went to Spain twice, once to study St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross, and once to walk the Camino de Santiago. The Camino is one of the three major pilgrimage routes from medieval times. This six-week 500 mile journey has proven most significant in my spiritual education and influences me still. My journeys to Ireland, Scotland and New Mexico have fed my interest in Celtic and Native American spiritualities.

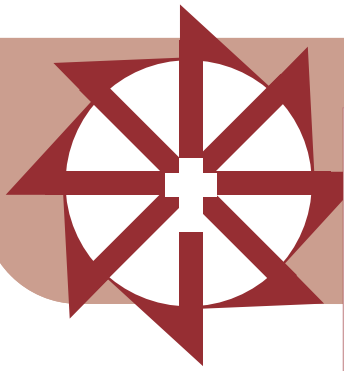
I have been active in the Episcopal Church at both parish and diocesan levels. I served on the vestry of St. Patrick’s Episcopal Church where I lead retreats, teaching days and quiet days. I also served several years as a delegate for St. Patrick’s at Diocesan Council.

I had one term as Diocesan DOK 1st vice-president and one term as Diocesan president for the DOK. I was one of the founding members of the diocesan Commission on Spiritual Formation and served as Chair for the commission for several years. It was through the Commission on Spiritual Formation that I met Dr. John Westerhoff and was invited to teach the Shalem Peer Supervision model to the participants in his Spiritual Formation program. I went on to become one of the directors of Omega Point which was the continuation of Dr. Westerhoff’s program.

I accepted an invitation to be on the Diocesan Long-Range Strategic Planning Committee of which Fr. Jim Nixon was Chair. Fr. Jim served on the Omega Point Board of Directors and I asked for his participation on the Bishop’s Pilgrimage Committee. I have continued with my spiritual direction work alongside of my committee work and have touched into prison ministry, hospice/hospital chaplaincy, and ministry with the homeless. Currently, my primary focus is spiritual formation with “un”churched people who have a desire to explore and deepen their relationship with God outside of “organized religion.”

My personal journey has been fluid, multi-faceted, and held gently in God’s hands – as has your journey. I’m grateful that you, as individuals and as a community, are now a part of my journey and that God is present with us to enfold us in His care and to encourage us to be reflectors of His love in the world around us.
